Bramble Park Revitalization (Upper Level)

Bramble Park Revitalization (Lower Level)

Reasoning:

Please evaluate and implement stronger pedestrian safety measures within Madisonville. We are concerned by the rates of speed with which drivers frequently ride through Madisonville. Madisonville Community Council is deeply committed to improving the walkability, safety, and vitality of our neighborhood. We believe walk-ability and safety are crucial both on major arterial roads and our school crossings.

Traffic Study

We would like to request that DOTE conduct a Safety Study Plainville and Roe. We have been concerned in recent years by an escalated number of traffic accidents at this intersection. Safety measures or other options DOTE might propose after the conclusion of a Safety Study Plainville and Roe may include:

- Improved Signage: Drivers need to be reminded of the reduced speeds in our business district.
- 4-way stop signage *or*
- Traffic signal with the inclusion of left turn only lanes to improve the flow of traffic at this intersection

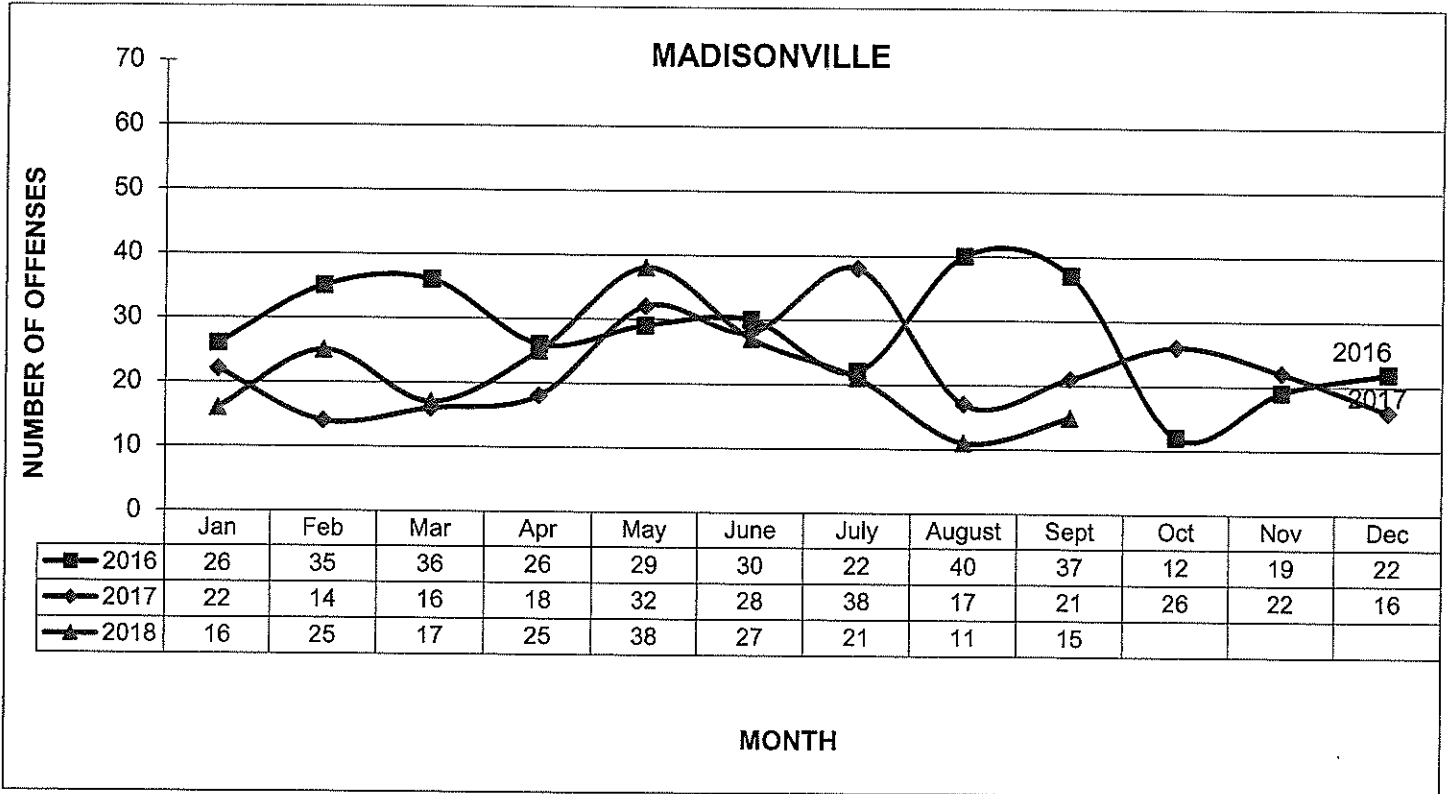

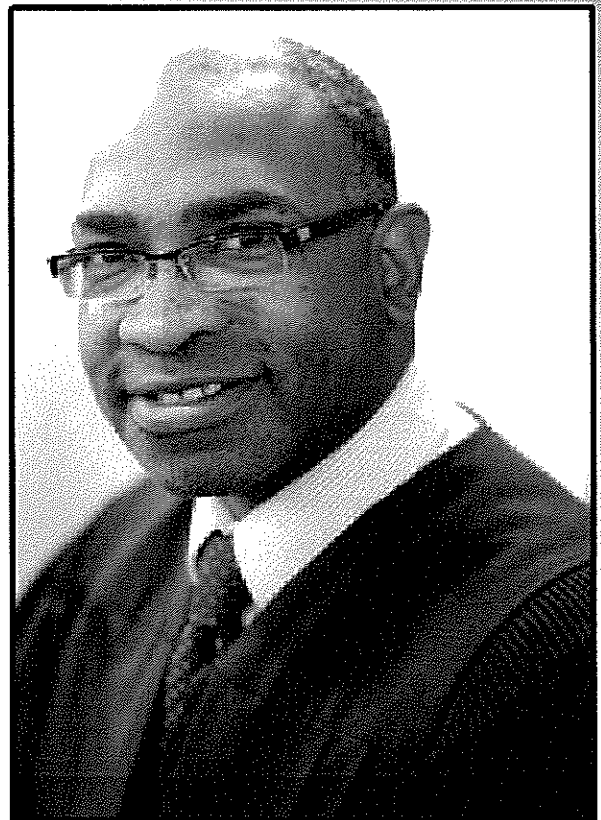
