Ineligible Projects

- Requests for services already provided by another city department
- Requests for public funds to improve private property
- Projects more suitably funded by a philanthropic source
- Improvements to offset the impact of anticipated private development
- Projects not consistent with current City Council policies and direction
- Projects lacking a viable maintenance and/or operational entity
- Routine maintenance items
 - *Examples: light outages, missing damaged signs, or faded pavement markings*
- Overpriced equipment or high-end merchandise
 - *Examples: high-end flashlights and camcorders for patrol groups, laptop computers*
- Projects to fund organizations' operational expenses
- Survey panhandlers
- Off-street parking
- Lighting and fencing of vacant lots
- Lot cleanup
- Any new major new facility construction for parks
