CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to by the President, Kate Botos, at 7:04 P.M. The meeting was opened with a moment of silence followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the September 20, 2018 Council meeting were approved as distributed.

COMMUNITY ADMINISTRATION PRESENTATIONS

We received reports from the Cincinnati Police Department regarding the latest crime incidents; John P. Parker School; Representative of the Hamilton County Children's Services levy campaign; and Hamilton county Land Reutilization Corporation by William Basil and Amy Bancroft. There were no reports from Cincinnati Fire Department and Shroder Paideia.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Kate reported on Mariemont Kroger hiring; Healthcare Access program on 10/21; Invest in Neighborhoods program; ODOT Red Bank Corridor hearings; and the need for a new Corresponding secretary after his resignation.

TREASURER REPORT

The Treasurer's report was approved as distributed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

We received committee reports from Communications, Crime Prevention & Safety; History; Madisonville Cares, Membership, and Madisonville Youth Council.

AGENCY ANNOUNCEMENTS

We received Agency reports from Artsville, Cincinnati Recreation Center, Madisonville Weed & Seed, Madisonville Business Chamber, and MCURC. There was no report from MEAC. Particular mention was made of the selection of Madisonville's own, Rosemary Tanks, for inclusion in the Seniors Hall of Fame.

OLD BUSINESS

A motion was made and seconded to approve the NSP Budget as recommended by the MCC Board. Motion passed, 17-0. A motion was made and seconded to "sell" the 140 chairs owned by MCC to the Cincinnati Toolbank for a \$2100 credit to use at the Toolbank. Motion passed, 17-0.

NEW BUSINESS

Josh Mattie presented ideas for a Madisonville flag, a project the city is encouraging. The consensus from all present was the ideas were not acceptable. The preference was to use the new logo in some manner.

A presentation was made from Taking Root. It included formal arrangements in the Foraging Garden at Erie, Brotherton, and Red Bank; sixteen (16) trees at John P. Parker; and a plan to trim and straighten trees in Madisonville. A motion was made that \$250 from Art, Parks, & Recreation budget be used for the trees at John P. Parker. Motion passed, 17-0.
